Arnold B. Asterino.

Born March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1920

Passed away on May 3rd, 2002

He held the rank of 2nd Lieutenant in the 10<sup>Th</sup> Air Force,

9<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group, 7<sup>th</sup> Bomb Squadron.

He also served in Pandeshwar, India-Burma-China theater, with the 494rd Bomb Squadron, 7<sup>th</sup> Bomb Group.

He was a bombardier/navigator/pilot and a certified aerial gunner on a B-24 Liberator.

He flew 25 missions and was awarded a Bronze Service Star,

Asiatic-Pacific Campaign medal, WWII Victory,

Air medal and Good Conduct medal.
